When did AOSOS become operational in your state?	AOSOS became operational in Kentucky on May 7, 2002.
What software/system did your state convert from?	Office of Employment & Training (OET) was using America's Workforce System for Employment Services (AWSES). Department for Training and Re-Employment (DTR) was using an internally developed mainframe application.
Do you support your own hardware or is your hardware hosted? If you support your own, list the hardware used by your state.	<p>Kentucky supports their own hardware. Current System Configuration: Sun Microsystems T5140 Memory size: 32544 Megabytes Processor: SUNW,UltraSPARC-T2+ OS: SOLARIS 10</p> <p>This hardware hosts both the test and production version. We use totally 18 domains in the server for hosting development, test and production environments.</p>
How does your state use the API process?	<p>API's are used in Kentucky's Focus Suites products. API's are used in AOSOS to populate Worker Profiling fields and in the UI Internet Claims process to register claimants in AOSOS.</p> <p>We also use API's for list management to delete old unused lists, to update NCRC data to EKOS and originally for data conversion for DTR.</p>
Identify what resources (staff) support & maintain AOSOS in your state?	<p>Kentucky's Department of Technology Services (DTS) provides support and maintenance of the system. We have developers that work with the vendor to maintain the Focus Suites products, reports and any additional requirements that arise.</p> <p>We also have oracle dba's and unix administrators to support the system.</p> <p>Office of Employment & Training devotes a full time position as an Advocate of the system for the five Offices of the Education Cabinet and other entities. Two full time staff dedicated to travel across the state conducting training in a hands-on approach and through scheduled training sessions. Seven OET staff have responsibilities that include Q&A, testing of the system, Help Desk, and working with reports.</p>
