How does your state use the API process?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ For adding and updating customer records when individuals file new UI claims ▪ For updating customers' UI status based on UI certifications and payments ▪ Two way interface of data between OSOS and a state developed Reemployment Services System (REOS) which provides added functionality to case manage, schedule, and track reemployment activities of UI claimants ▪ For adding and updating customer records from local legacy JTPA/ WIA systems for one-time conversion of local WIBs to OSOS ▪ For real time data interface with NYC LWIA and other partnering agencies in production. This allows these entities to use their current local system(s) as their front-end, while sharing data with the OSOS database on the back-end ▪ For State Functional Alignment initiative – eliminate duplicate manual data entry needed to co-enroll in both ES and WIA programs based on a single service entry by using API to auto-generate the WIA co-enrollment thru an overnight batch process

Why did your state choose AOSOS?	In the mid- 1990's, we began developing a new Employment Service system in lieu of the remediation effort required to bring our ES legacy into Y2K compliance. With the need to implement the WIA legislation approaching, however, we became aware that we needed a One-Stop system rather than a new ES system. The original decision was based on the availability of the federally supported America's One-Stop Operating system (AOSOS) as the most cost efficient way to obtain a One-Stop system.
